Eliminates tax on income up to \$6150 (\$12,300 married filing jointly)	Yes	No
Simplifies tax code to 5.25 and is a tax cut for ALL	Yes	No
Eliminates Social Security from income tax	Yes	Yes
Standard Deduction increases each year with inflation	Yes	No
